DTC Fundamentals from Concept to Deployment This session provides a practical foundation for understanding Digital Travel Credentials (DTCs) and how they transition from concept to real-world deployment. Building on lessons learned from ICAO workshops and early implementations, the discussion will clarify the roles of physical and virtual components, explore approaches to virtual credential issuance and associated trust models, and examine how existing document validation mechanisms can be leveraged.
